APPROVAL OF THE MARCH 8, 2022 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES:

<u>Director Kembel made the motion to approve the March 8, 2022 Executive Committee Minutes as presented. Director Kendrick seconded. Motion passed unanimously.</u>

FINANCE REPORT:

Treasurer Coyne reviewed the financial report for the month of March. <u>Treasurer Coyne then</u> made the motion to approve payment of District checks 16262 – 16306 and Julesburg recharge checks 1154 – 1166. Director Mari seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

RIVER MONITORING:

Division I Water Court Resume':

No statements of opposition will be filed from the February 2022 Water Court Resume'.

Manager Frank noted that Castle Rock did file an amendment to their case 21CW3185 for water rights in Fremont and associated structures. Lower is already in the case so no further action is needed at this time.

Julesburg Recharge Project:

- The TGR agreement has been finalized and recorded.
- Manager Frank will send Counsel Donovan the final costs incurred in the Woodhams well deletion for the tax lien.
- A status conference has been set for July 14th regarding Lower's decree and SWSP. Harmony is the only objector in the case. Most of Harmony's comments center around the new TGR project.

Heyborne Recharge Project:

Heyborne is currently retiming excess recharge accretions into Pond 2 through April.

LEGAL REPORT:

The board will need to recess into executive session to discuss legal issues.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Fritzler and Manager Frank updated the board on the informative Chimney Hollow Reservoir tour given to Lower's board members by Northern's staff. The projected date that the reservoir will start filling is June of 2025.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Legislative Issues:

• WRASP – Manager Frank stated that the group has taken a monitor position on 22 SB114 concerning fire suppression ponds which would allow counties to have a maximum of thirty acres of ponds in their county for fire suppression.

General Matters:

- SPWRAP The next quarterly board meeting will be held virtually on April 21, 2022.
 - All Tamarack wells were shut off the end of March.
- NE Colorado Water Cooperative Manager Frank noted that the Water SMART grant is extended through December of 2022. The annual meeting for NECWC will be held either the end of May or the first part of June to discuss the co-op's future plans. Brown and Caldwell will be analyzing the benefits of the Platte Valley Water Partnership for optimizing water supplies to co-op members and other water users in Water Districts 1 and 64.
- South Platte Basin Round Table (SPBRT) will be meeting later today in person.
- South Platte Regional Opportunities Water Group (SPROWG)- The next meeting
 of the group will be held April 19th. Even though Lower is no longer a paying
 member of the group, Manager Frank stated that he and Jim Yahn will continue to
 attend meetings in an advisory capacity to maintain an agriculture presence in the
 group.
